Martin Emmerer is an Austrian architect. The new southern wing of the castle museum in Linz can be named one of his most important realized projects. His passion for architecture is attended by his expertise in computer aided architectural design and programming. Martin Emmerer holds a doctorate degree in technical science, is visiting lecturer and guest critic at different Universities. After working under the name Hope of Glory aka HoG architecture for 15 years he decided to rename his office Studio Emmerer.

Studio Emmerer follows a systemic approach that continues from the design to the detailed planning. "We develop narratives together with spatial principles of order and apply them to the concrete site, then we observe what emerges, sometimes we intervene and change or break the rules." In this way, generic architecture enters into a dialog with personal statement and poetry. Studio Emmerer believes in relevance over niceness or passing fads. Therefore, its architecture is clear, radical, and sustainable.

Martin Emmerer's passion for architecture is attended by his expertise in computer aided architectural design and programming. Since 2010 he leads the development Archilles Pro, a lean AI-driven collaborative design tool for architects. Studio Emmerer uses Archilles Pro in all of its design projects and constantly creates concepts for innovative new features that are implemented and tested subsequently.
